

REGISTRATION FORM - GARDENER/FOOD-GROWER

Before completing this form, please consider the following points:

- You will be 'adopting' part (or all) of someone's garden/land to grow fruit and vegetables and not for the purposes of keeping any form of livestock (such as hens or bees)
- You will be able to visit the garden/land to tend your crops at times agreed beforehand
- If the land owner no longer wishes their garden/land to be used you will be given a reasonable period of notice and not less than 6 weeks
- The first meeting will be mediated by Growing Opportunities when an agreement will be drawn up between the food-grower and the land-owner
